Prosthesis Program

Who is it for?

This service is not just for women, but also for young adults and children.

Women who have experienced a mastectomy or other surgery necessitating a prosthesis are eligible for assistance.

How is it funded?

The Wig and Prosthesis Program is funded directly by donation. Contributions to this program allow Hospice of Yuma to purchase the wigs and prostheses. Local community groups and individuals knit and sew hats and scarves.

What is the cost to me?

There is no charge to the recipient for the wigs, hats, scarves, prostheses or bras.

Who is eligible?

Hospice of Yuma's Wig and Prosthesis Program is a service available to any eligible person in the Yuma Community who is suffering from a loss of hair due to illness or cancer treatment and either do not have insurance or their insurance will not cover the cost of a wig.

Hospice of Yuma serves an average of 10 people per month, fitting them with either a prosthesis or wig.

If you or someone you know is in need of this service, please come to the Hospice of Yuma office between 8:00am - 5:00pm, Monday through Friday and an experienced staff member will be available to assist you.
