This is how my story begins

My name is Gail Gotchie, and I would like to share my story with you.

My husband, Gerald (Jerry) Gotchie, was born and raised in Minnesota. He retired from the military as a Marine Firefighter but continued working for another 20 years as a Federal Firefighter/Inspector. Once Jerry retired for the second time, he started volunteering with the local fishing & hunting clubs.

A few years later, I decided it was time for me to retire as well. We always wanted to travel, so we decided to downsize and purchased a fifth wheel. We began traveling each year to Minnesota, Jerry's hometown. We became snowbirds. We would spend six months in Minnesota and six months in Yuma, Arizona.

In April of 2019, Jerry was diagnosed with pulmonary fibrosis, but that wasn't going to stop our summer trip! We packed up the RV and away we went. We made it as far as Socorro, New Mexico when Jerry had his first stroke. We returned home to Yuma, so that Jerry could have surgery. Then in September, he was diagnosed with rheumatoid arthritis.

Over the course of time, Jerry's health started deteriorating. His lung capacity decreased and by the end of December, he required oxygen.

Everything happened so fast, so quick. I felt my world had been turned upside down, and if that wasn't enough, we received more news. Jerry had bladder cancer. I just couldn't wrap my head around all of this. It was so much. How could this be, my husband, Jerry, was the picture of perfect health! Everyone in the family joked that he would outlive us all. I was devastated, but I was strong, for Jerry. He needed me as much as I needed him. He was my everything.

For the next few months, it was a constant travel to Phoenix and back to Yuma for Jerry's cancer treatments.

In April of 2021 Jerry had another stroke that required home health care services. There was a registered nurse, physical therapist, and occupational therapist. They would visit Monday thru Friday, and weekends if needed. Jerry was a proud man and wasn't the type to ask for help and only wanted my help. He didn't want me to leave his side every time he was admitted to the hospital.

I was sleeping about three hours a night. I was exhausted, physically, emotionally, and spiritually. I needed help. I needed to do something. I could not keep going on pure adrenaline.

I knew about Hospice of Yuma as several of our family members and close friends had lost a loved one. They mentioned how Hospice of Yuma helped them and gave them the support they needed during a difficult time in life and how it was a true blessing. Hearing all these wonderful things about Hospice of Yuma, left a very strong impression on me. I always knew that if ever I needed hospice care, Hospice of Yuma would be my first phone call.

As time went by, I knew I needed help. However, just the utter of the words "hospice care" and the first thing one thinks is "death" and those thoughts were so true for my husband when I would mention it in general conversation. I explained to my husband that I needed an extra set of hands to help with his care and I that I needed some rest as I was exhausted.

There is an ol' saying "you get more bees with honey", so I thought I will plant the seed about hospice care and let him think about it for a while. Then it would be his idea and it would be a great idea. I also mentioned to the home health care nurse how exhausted I was and thinking about hospice care for my husband but didn't know if he would be ready to discuss it yet. The nurse told me she would be doing her evaluation and would discuss his care along with my needs. After speaking with the nurse, Jerry saw that I needed the help and was open to discuss hospice care. Jerry realized the help would allow me to spend more time with him, so Jerry gave the home health care nurse the okay to move forward with the Hospice of Yuma referral.

Within a day we had our first meeting with Hospice of Yuma to discuss all they had to offer. Then we met our team or as I like to say, "Our Extended Family", because that's what they became. Our nurse Christina, what can I say, was like a sister. She was ready to answer any questions I had and was very straight forward. She kept me informed as to what was happening and what to expect while keeping me grounded. She always told me "You missed your calling; you should have been a nurse!!!" Tim, our Social Butterfly as we liked to call him, visited often and was fascinated with my husband's stories about Native American background and when my husband worked under the Command of a United States President. They could go on for hours. Kent, our Chaplain visited regularly. What a blessing! Listening to my husband's stories (boy did he have the stories) and spiritual questions, but most of all just praying with us.

My husband was only under hospice care for 2-1/2 weeks and I'm very blessed to have had Hospice of Yuma and all the staff from beginning to end. They were very caring, helpful and compassionate. If I could say one thing, Death completes the "Circle of Life", and Hospice of Yuma does it with Dignity.

A Message from John Williams, Executive Director

As we enter the fall, I would like to take this opportunity to thank those of you who have given donations for ongoing support to our organization. Hospice of Yuma continues to fulfill its mission in caring for the terminally ill in our community and we are proud to say that we have never turned a patient away because they did not have insurance or the ability to pay. We have been able to care for the uninsured due to the generosity of donors like you.



Hospice of Yuma like most families and businesses has been impacted by inflation. As we were struggling already due to yet another cut in Medicare reimbursement, and inflation, the cost of caring for patients has skyrocketed. There have been many times that reimbursement from insurance providers does not cover the cost of everything a patient needs especially specialty medications and medical supplies. Because of this we are now even more dependent on community support to help us fulfill our mission and help with patient care when insurance reimbursement simply is not keeping up with the increases in cost. As an organization we have worked hard to make cuts to non-essential items in our budget, but even with our attempts we often fall short.

As the economy continues to fluctuate, finding extra funding to assist with charitable care and rising expenses becomes more difficult. I want to stay positive but as the cost of services, medications, medical equipment, and supplies continue to rise, I am appealing to the community for help. This November will mark the beginning of our 42nd year as Yuma's only nonprofit hospice. November is also National Hospice Month and the beginning of our "I Make a Difference Campaign". I am asking our community to participate in the campaign. Your financial assistance will make a huge impact in lives of the patients and families we serve. As you read this newsletter the information for the "I Make a Difference Campaign" is on pages 6 and 7. Please take the opportunity to read about it and consider giving to help us help the community.

Your contributions really make a difference in the well-being of our patients and their families. We continue to gladly care for the terminally ill and we are also a source of comfort to their families. Even though times might be difficult, we carry on with our mission of being the best Hospice in Yuma.

Resilience During Difficult Times

I believe we all have noticed how hard it has been since this pandemic started: household chaos, continuous changes in our routines, school closures, economic shocks, caregivers trying their very best assisting their loved ones. All these disruptions have been extremely challenging, and we all adjust every day, hoping that this new transition stabilizes soon. As a bereavement counselor, there are moments when I also take a pause, to breathe, to sit down and realize that what our grievers have been through is not just the physical and emotional pain of their loss, but also, the hardship from moving forward and trying their best to be able to recover and function as we all adjust.

I recently read a phrase that I found interesting: "Be proud of yourself if you just showed up today", many other people just couldn't have that opportunity because of several reasons. That phrase made me think of myself getting up from bed every morning to have the opportunity to meet new people and become an instrument and support. There's no way I could be able to do what I love to do if there's a lack of "resilience" which means to adopt active approaches to adversity and to view stress in a positive way, which leads us to improve our performances. We are the creators of the scenes personally and professionally and we also can become our own best friends to ourselves or our worst enemies. The choice is there and we can make that decision once we have recognized that we actually deal with problems and challenges daily. But it's the way I decide to act on those, that will eventually help me going through it, learning from the scenes and giving the best I have so I can feel at peace every night before going to bed.

I want to thank my co-worker Emilia Munoz, my supervisors, my coworkers, our bereavement volunteers for just showing up every day, and to every single person who comes to the office looking for Hope and allowing themselves to receive support when they need it the most since it takes a brave heart to admit that there are moments in our lives when we just can't walk through the emotional loss on our own. I know that every single one of us is doing their best and we just keep "showing up".
