## This is my story on how Hospice of Yuma's Grief Support Center helped me and I hope it will encourage you



The year 2022, from beginning to end forever changed me. Many of us get winter colds, but the end of 2021 my husband was unable to shake a nasty cough.

In January, the doctor handed us devastating news. Stage 4 lung cancer. Having never smoked, we were in total shock. We had been together for 25 years and had no intention of letting cancer divide us. John was strong and I pretended to be. He bravely endured many trips to the hospital and the cancer center for radiation, chemotherapy and more.

The first half of the year was filled with hope, tears and fear. Then June came. The worst month of my life. On June 7th my brother Mike was killed in a horrific bicycle vs truck accident. While my broken heart was trying to deal with that, 10 days later I had a knock at the door. News that no parent ever wants to hear; my beautiful 44 year old daughter was deceased. Her troubled life led her to the decision to end her life. I wondered how I could go on, but my husband needed me so I found a way.

> John's treatment did not slow down the progress of his cancer. I read about the opening of the Hospice Grief Center and told him about it. Part of me wanted to go but it was not a time for celebrating for us. It was enough to know that it existed because I knew I would be there all too soon. I lost my mother in 2018 after her battle with cancer. I experienced hospice with her, and became one of her caregivers. I knew what was coming.

John and I both turned 70 in late 2022. Our plans to really celebrate that milestone never had a chance. His birthday came first, mine 2 months later. Mine was spent with him in the hospital. We were told to pick a hospice company. He came home the next day and I became his caregiver. He passed away six days later. His HOY team helped me so much through everything.

#### **DIRECTOR'S CORNER**

I wish we had had hospice sooner..." I have lost count of the number of times I have had someone say this to me or one of our Hospice of Yuma staff members. Many times, we hear it weeks, months, and even years after their loved one experienced our care at the end of life. I always accept the statement as a compliment that reflects our staff's wonderful work, but it is also a sad reminder that so many terminally ill patients come on service so late in their illness that we do not have the time to assist them and their families fully. Too often, a patient comes to us for only a matter of days when we could have been improving the quality of their life and supporting their family weeks or months earlier. When faced with a terminal diagnosis, it is never too early to talk to your physician about receiving services through Hospice of Yuma.

Hospice of Yuma staff will take the time to listen, answer questions, and honor your choices, even if that means you choose not to have hospice services. If you or a loved one is eligible for hospice care, we will support you step by step in putting services in place. We understand that coping with a terminal illness is challenging for everyone involved and that is why our care is family focused. Our team of compassionate hospice professionals provides more than medical support. We specialize in the emotional and spiritual issues associated with the end-of-life, as well.

We know that with multiple hospice providers in Yuma County patients have a choice, and we want to make sure that you make the best decision possible when choosing a hospice. Not all hospice providers are alike. Please keep in mind the following:

Hospice of Yuma is the only Non-Profit Hospice in Yuma County. Study after study for the past decade has indicated that Not-For-Profit Hospice providers are more likely to be patient-focused and provide more services. Hospice of Yuma has a 42-year history of providing the best end of life care possible in our area. Our patients are more than just a number or a source of revenue. They will always be our first priority. No other hospice provider in our area can guarantee this. Hospice of Yuma is the only local hospice that has a full-time Medical Director. Dr Michael Shea, our Medical Director, is available to make home visits to patients when needed. He is our dedicated hospice physician, with years of experience in Hospice and Palliative Medicine. No other hospice provider in our area can guarantee this.

#### Hospice of Yuma as a hospice provider does not pay incentives to its employees for referrals. We believe hospice patients and referrals are not for sale.

Many for-profit hospice providers choose to pay their marketing and clinical staff referral bonuses for every patient who is admitted. This incentive practice in hospice has been at the center of many federal investigations and fraudulent behavior, including payment kickbacks to referring providers and health care facilities. Over the past ten years, the Federal Government has increased the number of investigations proving that this has become an epidemic, fraudulent practice.

At Hospice of Yuma, our Hospice Liaisons focus on education, support, and assisting families to obtain what they need, even if that is not hospice services. Hospice of Yuma staff will never upsell or use pressure tactics to coerce patients to have families sign up for hospice services. We believe the best choices are made when people are educated to all their options and can carefully weigh out what is best for their loved ones. No other hospice provider in our area can guarantee this.

## Hospice of Yuma has the lowest patient to nurse ratio of any area hospice provider.

While most hospice providers have significantly increased nursing caseloads, Hospice of Yuma has kept our nursing caseloads below the National Average to ensure our patients have access to nursing care when they need it. We believe that hospice patients are the priority not the profit. No other hospice provider in our area can guarantee this.



## **GRIEF SUPPORT SERVICES**

Ways to Support Someone Who is Grieving This article appeared in the issue of Harvard Health Publishing's online newsletter from Harvard Medical School

It can be hard to know how to console a friend or relative who is grieving. If it seems that nothing you can do or say helps, don't give up. You can't take the pain away, but our presence is more important than it seems. Accept that you can't fix the situation or make your friend or relative feel better. Instead just be present and offer hope and a positive outlook toward the future. Recognize that griet is a gradual process.

Ĕven small gestures—sending a card or flowers, delivering a meal, helping out with laundry or shopping, or making a regular date to listen and offer support-can be a huge source of comfort to a person who is grieving. One woman, a dog lover who had recently lost her husband, recalled her joy when a close friend went to the pound and brought her a basket of puppies that needed to be fostered for a few weeks.

It's important to be flexible and open to a person's way of grieving. For example, if a bereaved friend or family member is coming to your house for the holidays, ask if you can do anything to help mark the loss during this occasion. Be willing to leave plans loose. Build in a loophole when you extend the invitation: "We would love to have you join us. You needn't decide until the last minute, if you want some time to think about it." Gently press a person to accept your invitation, but take "no" for an answer without ire. Call the next day to check in. It is sometimes difficult to know what to say to a bereaved person. If you find yourself tongue-tied or uncertain of what to do in the face of someone's loss, here are some ideas to help you.

 Name names. Don't be afraid to mention the deceased. It won't make your friend any sadder, although it may prompt tears. It's terrible to feel that someone you love must forever be expunged from memory and conversation.

Saying how much you'll miss the person is much

better than the perfunctory, "I'm sorry for your loss."
Don't ask, "How are you?" The answer is obvious -"not good"-and because it's the same greeting you would offer anyone, it doesn't acknowledge that your friend has suffered a devastating loss. Instead try, "How are you feeling today?"

 Offer hope. People who have gone through grieving often remember that it is the person who offered reassuring hope, the certainty that things will get better, who helped them make the gradual passage from pain to a renewed sense of life. Be careful, though, about being to glib, as doing so may make the bereaved person feel even more isolated. Rather, say something like: "You will grieve for as long as you need to, but you are a strong person, and will find your way through this." This remark both acknowledges that there is no quick and easy solution and also affirms your confidence that things will improve.

• Reach out. Call to express your sympathy. Try to steer clear of such phrases as "It's God's will" or "It's for the best" unless the bereaved person says this first. Your friend or relative may need you even more after the first few weeks and months, when other people may stop calling. Check in every now and then just to say hello (you may find it helpful to put reminders on your calendar). Most bereaved people find it difficult to reach out and need others to take the initiative.

• Help out. Don't just ask if you can "do anything." That transfers the burden to the bereaved, and he or she may be reluctant to make a request. Instead, be specific when offering help. Bring dinner over, pass on information about funeral arrangements, or answer the phone. Pitch in to clean up the kitchen. Sometimes your help is most valuable later. A lawyer might help answer questions about the estate. A handy person might button up the house as winter approaches.

• Assist with meals. Provide hands-on assistance with cooking, and volunteer to help with shopping. For many bereaved persons, particularly widows and widowers, it can be a big adjustment to get accustomed to planning meals, shopping for groceries, and cooking for just one person.

• Listen well instead of advising. A sympathetic ear is a wonderful thing. A friend who listens even when the same story is told with little variation is even better. Often, people work through grief and trauma by telling their story over and over. Unless you are asked for your advice, don't be quick to offer it. Frequently, those who are grieving really others would just listen. It's wish your understanding—not your advice—that is most sorely needed.

Avoid judgments. Your friend's life and emotional landscape have changed enormously, possibly forever. You may wish he or she would move on, but you can't speed the process or even ensure that it happens. Let your friend heal at the pace that feels right and in his or her own manner. "You should cry" or "It's time to move on" aren't really helpful directions.

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
