Director's Corner

A Message from John Williams, Executive Director

What Hospice Care REALLY is ...

One of the saddest things I hear from patients' families after having a loved one cared for by Hospice of Yuma, is that they wish that had had hospice come in sooner to care for their loved one. Many people have an idea of what they believe hospice is or even have an unspoken fear of what having hospice care means. Many patients and their families decline hospice care because the patient is "not ready to die." I understand and empathize with someone who does not want to die, but receiving hospice care does not cause death. The reality is hospice care enhances many patients' quality of life so that they are able to enjoy more of their time with family and friends. Hospice is a holistic approach focused on palliation, not curative care.

One of the biggest myths about hospice care is that the patient or family has given up. Many believe hospice is only for those with limited days or weeks to live, but that is simply not true. The goal of hospice is to maintain or improve the quality of life for the patient whose illness, or disease is considered end-stage which under normal circumstances is not curable. Hospice care emphasizes the control of **pain and symptom management** of a disease. It also plays a major role in offering comfort and support to the patient and their families during such a delicate time.

Hospice does not speed up the onset of death. In fact, some patients receiving hospice care live longer. This is because their quality of life and emotional well-being have improved and allowed their body time to plateau instead of continuing to worsen. The biggest difference between hospice care and traditional medical care is that hospice care no longer focuses on "curing" the patient. It instead focuses on enhancing the patient's **quality of life** by controlling symptoms such as pain and discomfort.

For a patient to receive hospice care, a physician must certify that the patient may not live beyond six months. However, do not dwell on this six-month time frame. The physician is not guaranteeing the patient will pass away within six months; physicians are required to reevaluate patients periodically to determine whether they still qualify for hospice care. Hospice care is excellent for patients in progressive stages of non-curable diseases. One of the advantages of hospice is that physicians and interdisciplinary medical staff come to the patient's home. This can be extremely helpful for patients who are too weak or ill to travel outside the home. The focus is to offer life with dignity.

Hospice provides family and caregiver support. Hospice offers families and caregivers comfort, guidance, and grief counseling, which is not often provided in traditional medical care. Hospice offers Social, Emotional, Spiritual, and Psychological Support to all patients and families every day of the week. Hospice care is also typically less expensive than hospital stays or emergency room visits and is covered under Medicare and many insurance plans. Furthermore, there is no cost to the patient for medications or medical equipment related to the patient's hospice diagnosis.


Hospice does educate and assists patients and their families with **Death Preparedness**. Planning and having things in place brings peace of mind, removes the burden off of families and caregivers of having increased pressure to make decisions at a time they are grieving. Hospice also promotes leaving a **Legacy** to one's family, friends, and community. Hospice promotes that the love, wisdom, and treasures we pass down are important. Future generations, friends, and our community are better when we pass our legacy along to them.

As well as to lighten the burden of the family and provide them with time to recharge.

Grief Support Center

Life... how does one explain it. If you ask several people, I guarantee each person will have a different response. Life has ups and downs, highs and lows, good and bad. Some people may take life for granted and others may cherish it. Some live wild and free and others walk a fine line one day at a time. Life may be easy for some and for others it may not be as easy as one would think, but life goes



on and you do the best that you can do, for yourself, for your family, and for others.

In September of 2022, Hospice of Yuma opened a Grief Support Center. The only one in Yuma County. Since our doors opened, we have received many people from the community seeking grief support and that is how we met Mr. Manuel Garcia. Manuel was a single parent raising three very young children, two boys and a girl. Manuel was a hands-on dad with all his kids. Andrew, the middle child, who was 5 years old at the time, told his father that he loved sunflowers and would love to have a sunflower garden of his own.


Manuel, wanting to make his children happy and give them the best that he could, being a single parent, started a sunflower garden with Andrew in their backyard.

As the years went by and the kids got older, and went to college to further their education, Manuel continued to care for the sunflower garden. Andrew still admired the sunflowers and every time he saw them, he would always let his father know how much he loved the sunflowers. Andrew received his nursing degree and became a full-time registered nurse.

In 2019, tragedy happened, and Andrew passed away in his early 30s. Manuel was devastated and could not understand why this happened to his son. One always thinks that a child should outlive the parent not the other way around. This took a toll on him, but he knew he needed to keep moving forward for

his other two kids. It was a journey for Manuel because of his close relationship with his son, Andrew.

To help himself stay focused and strong, Manuel continued growing sunflowers in the garden in memory of his son, Andrew. However, Manuel still needed help. He couldn't seem to get past his



sadness. One day he was talking to a friend about how he was feeling, and the friend had heard about Hospice of Yuma's Grief Support Center and told Manuel to give Hospice of Yuma a call and see if they would be able to help him. Manuel did not make that call right away, but eventually he did.

In August of 2022, Manuel met with Lorenia Villaescusa, one of our Grief Support Counselors. Manuel received 1-1 grief support and participated in "Loss of a Child" grief support group. Manuel also participated in and completed the Grief Recovery Method Program.

Manuel visits the Grief Support Center often bringing along the most beautiful sunflower bouquets one has ever seen. All the sunflower pictures you see in this article are from Manuel's sunflower garden. He stated that bringing the sunflowers helps him through his own grief journey. He is so thankful and his way of giving back is by bringing the sunflower bouquets for others to enjoy as well.



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
