Quality of Life Sometimes Means Getting a Second Chance

The end-of-life process brings a lot of uncertainty and many unknowns. This journey begins at the time of diagnosing a terminal illness. The patient, as well as family are faced with many questions: what treatment should I opt for; if any? Is my home equipped for my care? Who will care for me? How will I pay for my care? Amongst many other concerns.

For many, hospice care still comes along with many stigmas. Lack of information and understanding keep many patients away from taking advantage of services. Too often patients come onto hospice services with only days to live when patients and families could have benefited if hospice had been chosen as an option sooner. Each patient who enters hospice care is assigned an entire team, whose main focus is providing the best quality of life for the patient, and the team strives to become the family's biggest support system through the entire process. The team will not only focus on the patient's medical needs, but also the emotional, spiritual, and ensuring all basic needs are met, such as in the Journey of Mr. Manuel.

Manuel's journey began years ago, after a series of bad breaks. He found himself homeless, without a job and in poor health. He lived along the riverbanks with his best friend Chunky (his terrier mix dog). Manuel's mother, Eduarda, searched for him to ensure he was eating, and he was still alive. One day while looking for Manuel, he was found unresponsive and had severe wounds to his legs. Doing what any mother would, she called for help, and he was transported to YRMC for medical assistance. At the hospital, he was diagnosed with acute kidney illness which led him to become septic. The wounds to his legs were so severe that doctors were thinking about possible amputation if he did not respond to treatment. He and his mother were given the option to begin dialysis,

but once Manuel became stable, he refused dialysis and asked to be discharged. Worried about her son, Eduarda, asked doctors for other alternatives, to which they suggested hospice care.

Eduarda who lives outside of Hospice of Yuma's service area, knew that taking her ill son home was not an option, so she took it upon herself to ask a friend in the Yuma area, if she

would allow her son to borrow a room, to receive medical care. Luckily, her friend agreed. Eduarda stated “once I had a room for my son, I went to the Hospice of Yuma office to ask about services and within 10 minutes I was told that my son was eligible for hospice services, despite not having any medical insurance”. “Everything was set up so fast, that my son was in a bed, in a home, that same afternoon”. This is the moment that Manuel began his hospice journey.

At the time of his hospice admission, Manuel was bed bound, he was not eating, he had unmanaged pain, his wounds were actively bleeding, and he had intermittent altered cognition. He was assigned a team which included his Hospice Physician, Registered Nurse,

Social Worker, and a Licensed Nursing Assistant. As his nurse, I began making daily visits with the focus of pain management and wound care. His social worker began paperwork to get him medical insurance and the nursing assistant visited daily to provide personal hygiene care and ensure that he had clean clothes, and clean bed linen.

Manuel began to feel better; his pain was managed within a couple of days of his admission; his wounds stopped bleeding and slowly began to heal. He started to get an appetite and his cognitive status was restored. Manuel stated, “my hospice team helped me get better, if I would have stayed at the hospital I probably wouldn’t be here, or I wouldn’t have my legs anymore”. During his recovery, Manuel and Eduarda were asked to vacate the room in her friend’s house.

This is when his hospice social worker assisted Manuel by filling, faxing, and emailing paperwork to get approved for his very own apartment. During the time he waited to get his keys to his new apartment, his best friend Chunky fell ill. This affected Manuel’s emotional status to such a degree that he no longer wanted his apartment, he no longer had interest in eating, and he became sleep

deprived looking after his dog and providing him with comfort. After seeing the toll this took on Manuel, his hospice team worked together to find him resources so that Chunky could be cared for at a local veterinary clinic. Chunky received the care he needed, and Manuel’s health began to improve again.

“I thought that patients who went for hospice service were going to die, I never imagined that with the care and services I would get better and be discharged” Manuel says. “I was given a second chance on life, even Chunky was helped”. During the entire journey Eduarda remained by Manuel’s side. “The hospice team has helped my son so much. Thanks to the loving care he got, he is alive and doing well”. “I am so thankful for the donors that support Hospice of Yuma’s charitable care program. Thanks to their generosity and kindness, people like my son can get help”.

It has been a few months since Manuel’s discharge from hospice services. He is living in his very own apartment with Chunky, he now has medical insurance and is living independently.

Eduarda still keeps in contact with me and provides updates frequently, each time thanking me and the team for the work we have done with her son. As a Registered Nurse Case Manager, I am grateful to our community for their support and donations. I want all those that donate to Hospice of Yuma to know that they make a difference and sometimes their financial assistance even means helping a patient to have a second chance on life.

Director's Corner

As you have read our main article regarding Manuel and his journey on hospice, I hope we were able to help you understand what so many without insurance go through, especially with being diagnosed with a terminal illness. Manuel's story is unique in that the hospice care he received gave him a second chance at life. Not all without insurance have the same outcome but they all come to Hospice of Yuma suffering and wondering who will help them. It is rewarding for the Hospice of Yuma staff to share that there are people and businesses in the community that give towards their care since they have no insurance or ability to pay. Of course, we are talking about you, our donors. The patients and their families are often in disbelief because it is a shock for them to hear that someone cares enough to give money to help people they do not even know. This is why the Yuma community is so wonderful. We are a blessed community with people who care and are generous. For that, I am very thankful and the patients and families you help are as well.

Of all the patients that Hospice of Yuma cares for, those without insurance or the ability to pay are closest to my heart. Imagine for a moment that you are in a circumstance where you or your spouse loses a job. What would you do? To add to the financial problems, you have just been diagnosed with cancer and need medical care and chemotherapy. You cannot afford to pay for COBRA to keep your insurance and the oncologist cannot treat you for free. You try for assistance through the State but are denied because you do not meet the eligibility criteria. Without treatment, your cancer spreads rapidly, and you experience a great amount of pain and nausea. You go to the emergency room every few days because it is the only option available to receive medical care and pain medication. As hard as it might be to grasp, there are those among us in our community who are dying of a terminal illness and have no insurance or financial resources to assist them, just like Manuel. I cannot begin to overstate the importance of Hospice of Yuma's Charitable Care Program and the impact it has on patients and families in need. As we begin our new fiscal year in November the need for charitable end-of-life care in our community is always there. I am very thankful to those in the community who participated in giving during National Hospice Month in November and for all our Legacy Partners and end-of-year givers who give donations every December. Those gifts are crucial to meet the needs of those terminally ill patients without insurance.

Our commitment is to continue to accept every patient and family that needs our care regardless of insurance and ability to pay, but I know that the only way that this will be possible is through the continued generosity and financial support we receive from donors in the community. I understand that money at this time is limited, given the current economic challenges we all face. If you believe you are limited but still want to give a set amount like \$25.00. No amount is too small. For those who can give more, we ask that you consider the cost of 1 day of care on hospice services, which is \$160.00.

Please join us in caring for the terminally ill by providing a donation. The money you donate helps pay for hands-on compassionate care, medications, equipment, and the supplies that these terminally ill patients so desperately need. As long-term supporters and donors to Hospice of Yuma, you might wonder what kind of impact your contributions really make on the lives of the patients we were created to serve. One way our supporters and donors impact us is when you measure the amount of quality we provide in the care and services we give to patients and their families.

The Consumer Assessment of Healthcare Providers and Systems, CAHPS, Hospice Survey, developed by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, CMS, asks questions about family members' perception of the care provided to the patient, as well as their own hospice experience. As a hospice provider the CAHPS allows the community to view our performance in several areas regarding patient and family care and also provides benchmarks to gauge our performance relative to other hospice organizations in the state and throughout the country. Based on responses from patient's family members, Hospice of Yuma is the only **4-Star hospice provider** in Yuma County. We do not take this lightly and understand that if it were not for the support we receive from the community, Hospice of Yuma would not have the resources to achieve this type of milestone.

We now ask that you share this information. If you know someone, a family member, friend or neighbor who may need hospice services make sure they understand that quality in end-of-life care exists here in Yuma County. Bereavement Services

Grief Support Center

Hospice of Yuma's Grief Support Center opened September 27th, 2022. We would like to thank everyone who attended and made it a very memorable ceremony. We offer support group services for caring for caregivers, loss of spouse, loss of a child and loss of a parent. We continue to provide our community with emotional support through our bereavement services.

Grief Recovery Method

The Grief Recovery Method is a program that has been in place for the last 30 years. This program works with griever to make sure that every individual who participates can successfully identify losses through their lifetime and work through the emotional pain that the loss may have caused. They will also learn tools that will allow for the person to become more conscious about the significant losses and finally, to apply those tools and be able to recover from all the emotional pain caused by these losses.

During the last few months, we had several Grief Recovery Method sessions, which is an 8-week course. From those sessions, we had 28 individuals who completed and graduated from the program.

The next Grief Recovery Method course will start January 2023 at the Hospice of Yuma Grief Support Center and the San Luis library. Both will be available in English and Spanish. If you would like more information, please contact Lorenia Villaescusa or Emilia Munoz at (928)343-2222.
